French and Indian War	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - French and British fighting over land - Most of the Native Americans teamed up with French 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - British need to earn more money because of war debt - British decided to tax colonists - Britain gained more land
Stamp Act	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Tax on paper goods - Paper, books, card, ect. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Colonists started to get mad - Sam Adams led protests and boycotts
Quartering Act	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Soldiers are allowed to go into houses and people must give them food, shelter, clothes, ect. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Increased tension between colonies and Britain -
Townshend Act	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - British taxed many goods like glass, tea, paper, clothe 	Colonists boycotted British goods
Boston Massacre	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A crowd gathered in the streets - Colonists and soldiers started arguing 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 5 colonists got killed - Showed that tension was high between the two sides
Boston Tea Party/Tea Act	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Sons of Liberty dumped tea into the Boston harbor - Colonists were unhappy they had to pay tax on tea and left the tea on the boat 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The patriots refused to unload tea - Showed colonists were clear about message- they did not want tax!
Intolerable Act	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - This was a harsh punishment - British said that Boston could not have town meetings, elections, trade, ect. 	The other colonies came to their rescue and helped them.
